# USEFUL WORDS

Read and practice the vocabulary below.

**couchsurfing** - the practice of sleeping overnight in the houses of friends or fellow members of a social network, esp as an alternative to staying in hotels, hostels, etc

**homestay/farmstay**- a type of holiday or visit in which you stay in the home of a person you do not know ( at a farm stay you would be staying on a farm)

I like doing **homestays** when I travel because I get a chance to really get to know some of the locals.

**home exchange**- also known as house swapping, is an alternative means of travel accommodation, through which two parties agree to swap their homes for a set period of time, with no monetary exchange taking place.

The idea of **home exchanges** comes from low-cost vacation accommodation and are believed to date back to 1953.

Let's try out a **home exchange**. We won't have to spend any money on lodging!

**hostel/poshtel** - a cheap hotel where you can live when you are away from home/an upscale hostel which combines the "posh" style with the "hostel" sensibilities and price. A cheap & stylish hotel.

I'm low on money. Let's stay at a **hostel** or **poshtel** tonight.
